



Personality vs Behavior




Personality:

- An animal's individual likes and dislikes:
 - Energy level and exercise needs
 - Social enjoyment, tolerance and thresholds
 - Play style and natural outlets
 - Environmental preferences

Behavior:

- How an individual animal responds inwardly or outwardly to:
 - The environment
 - Things happening in the environment

Is Breed Important to Adopters?



It turns out, yes, it is!

- Of approximately 6.5 million searches, 39% of initial dog searches on AAP include breed, with an additional 7% editing their search to add breed.
- Top 5 breeds searched on AAP include Chihuahua, Labrador Retriever, Golden Retriever, German Shepherd, and Pit Bull Terrier.

Logical


- Whip-smart

You might find me challenging because I may be:


Not cut our for harsh conditions, great endurance, or rough play

Self-Directed Doting on you or following directions is often not the top priority











Recap


- Both breed and personality are important to adopters
